It is important to note that painter Katie Miller is drawing directly from artists who large they are practically commercial brands, namely John Currin and Lisa Yuskavage. Her artworkstypically, realistic paintings of babies with distorted features—tap into the same Freudian themes while diverging into selfreferential territory to question painting and its modes. Is it also important to mention that she's autistic? Maybe not, but it isn't something that the artist would shy away from: She's an activist in the neurodiversity movement, which aims to expand the normative boundaries of mental health. With her figurative paintings, though, she dives deep into troubling waters.
