Juxtaposed

At **Connersmith**, be dazzled by a dual show: oil portraits (painted with tiny brushes) by Katie Miller and C-print still lifes by Agniet Snoep. Miller edges her child subjects into mysterious narratives (like *Girl with Bright Colored Hair*), while Snoep posits insect life beside objects botanical and skeletal. The latter works gleam with the otherworldly import of Netherlandish painters, the "ancestors" of this Dutch-born artist.—*JLC*
